CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL: The meeting was called to order by Vice Chairman Lee McCahren. Chairman Sweetman had previously appointed Glenn Blumhardt as secretary pro-tem. Mr. Blumhardt noted that a quorum was present.

BOARD MEMBERS PRESENT: Lee McCahren, Dennis Landguth, Bob Morris, Glenn Blumhardt, and Pete Bullene. Linda Hilde and Rex Hagg participated via telephone.

BOARD MEMBERS ABSENT: Richard Sweetman and Doyle Karpen.

OTHERS PRESENT: See attached attendance sheet.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM OCTOBER 17, 2013, MEETING: Motion by Morris, seconded by Bullene, to approve the minutes from the October 17, 2013, Board of Minerals and Environment meeting. Motion carried.

MINING ISSUES: Prior to the meeting, the board received a table listing the department recommendations for releases of surety, transfers of liability and releases of liability (see attachment).

Bret Graves, DENR Minerals and Mining Program, answered questions from the board.

Motion by Blumhardt, seconded by Morris, to accept the department recommendations for releases of surety, transfer of liability and releases of surety, and releases of liability, as shown on the attached table. Motion carried.

Release of Liability and Surety for George W. Ketterling: Eric Holm reported that George Ketterling requested a release of liability for his placer gold exploration project located about nine miles southwest of Spearfish, South Dakota.

The final inspection took place on September 16, 2013. Mr. Ketterling affected less than one tenth of an acre during the project. No open trenches were found during the inspection and the affected area was revegetated.

The department recommended release of Mr. Ketterling's reclamation liability and Certificate of Deposit No. 70986, First National Bank, Pierre, SD, in the amount of \$200.

Motion by Morris, seconded by Landguth, to release liability for George W. Ketterling, Spearfish, SD, ENXI-397, and to release Certificate of Deposit No. 70986, First National Bank, Pierre, SD, in the amount of \$200. Motion carried.

FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW, AND ORDER IN THE MATTER OF OIL AND GAS CASE NO. 28-2013, LUFF EXPLORATION COMPANY, DENVER, CO: A transcript of these proceedings was prepared by the court reporter and is filed at the Department of Environment and Natural Resources office in Pierre, SD.

Hearing Chairman Bob Morris opened the hearing at 10:35 a.m. CST.

Case No. 28-2013 is the application of Luff Exploration Company, Denver, CO, for an order pooling all interests in a spacing unit for the South Medicine Pole Hills Field described as the E/2 of Section 33 and the W/2 of Section 34, T23N, R4E and the NW/4 of Section 3 and the NE/4 of Section 4, T22N, R4E, Harding County, SD, and to authorize the recovery of risk compensation in addition to the pro rata share of reasonable, actual costs from the interest of any lessee or unleased mineral owner who elects not to participate in the risk and cost of drilling and completing a well on said spacing unit.

Brett Koenecke, attorney from Pierre, SD, represented Luff Exploration Company.

Scott Sumner, attorney from Rapid City, represented Linda Golden, who filed a petition to intervene in this matter.

Roxanne Giedd, Deputy Attorney General, represented the Department of Environment and Natural Resources.

Charles McGuigan, Chief Deputy Attorney General, represented the Board of Minerals and Environment.

Prior to the hearing today, Mr. Morrison and Mr. Sumner submitted proposed Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law.

In addition to proposed Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law on submitted behalf of Linda Golden, Scott Sumner also submitted Ms. Golden's objections to Luff's proposed Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, a motion to reconsider the decision of the board, and a post-hearing brief in support of the motion to reconsider.

Mr. Morris stated that he reviewed the proposed Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and Ms. Golden's objections to the proposed Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law of Luff. He stated that in order to adequately express and represent the decision of the board, he proposed his own Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law using the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law proposed by the parties.

Following review of the proposed Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order, Hearing Chairman Morris requested board action.

Motion by McCahren, seconded by Bullene, to approve Ms. Giedd's recommended changes to the Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order prepared by Hearing Chairman Morris. A roll call vote was taken, and the motion carried. (Dennis Landguth abstained from voting.)
