

NOTICE OF REQUEST FOR DETERMINATION OF SPECIAL,
EXCEPTIONAL, CRITICAL, OR UNIQUE LANDS

Notice is hereby given that Bentonite Performance Minerals LLC, 554 US Highway 212, Belle Fourche, South Dakota 57717-4602, phone (307) 896-2596, has submitted a Request for Determination of Special, Exceptional, Critical, or Unique Lands and Notice of Intent to Operate to the Department of Environment and Natural Resources. The legal description of the proposed Killinger Mine is NE1/4 NE1/4 Section 22; T9N-R1E, Butte County. Bentonite Performance Minerals LLC has submitted the Request for Determination of Special, Exceptional, Critical, or Unique Lands and Notice of Intent to Operate for purposes of determining whether the lands potentially affected by the proposed mining operation are eligible for inclusion on the preliminary list of special, exceptional, critical, or unique lands.

The proposed operation involves mining for bentonite on land located approximately 6.5 miles northwest of Belle Fourche, South Dakota. Bentonite Performance Minerals LLC will affect approximately 29 acres during the life of the Killinger Mine. Several small pits will be mined using cut and fill mining methods. Topsoil, subsoil, and overburden will be stripped and stockpiled or used to backfill and topsoil previously mined pits. Bentonite will be hauled from each pit along existing haul roads to Bentonite Performance Minerals LLC's processing plants at Colony, Wyoming. Reclamation will be conducted concurrently with the mining operation. The land will be reclaimed to its present use of rangeland.
