**Gov. Noem Announces \$1.771 Million for Viborg Stormwater and Sanitary
Sewer Improvements**

PIERRE, S.D. – Gov. Kristi Noem says the state Board of Water and Natural Resources has approved a \$1,771,000 loan from the Clean Water State Revolving Fund Program for Viborg to make stormwater drainage improvements.

The loan will be administered through the Department of Environment and Natural Resources.

“I am pleased to announce that the City of Viborg will receive this assistance,” said Gov. Noem. “The funding will help the city make needed upgrades to its stormwater and sanitary sewer system to better serve its customers.”

Viborg will use the funding to make improvements to its stormwater and sanitary sewer infrastructure in the area of Park Avenue between Clark Street and South Nora Street. Storm sewer improvements include replacement of 1,100 feet of pipe, replacement of two inlets, and construction of four new inlets. Sanitary sewer improvements include replacement of approximately 3,200 feet of sewer main and associated connections, installation of 10 manholes and rehabilitation of five existing manholes.

The loan along with local funds will cover the total cost of the project. Loan terms are 2.5 percent for 30 years for the Clean Water State Revolving Fund loan.

The State of South Dakota and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency fund the Clean Water State Revolving Fund Program, which provides low-interest loans for wastewater, storm water and nonpoint source projects.

The board met today over the Digital Dakota Network.
